
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## **April** 2025

#### Reminders

- nappies/pants and spare clothes for the day, we enjoy lots of messy and outdoor play so spare clothes are essential. Please make sure all items of clothing are named! As the weather will start to warm up, please dress your child accordingly and remember sun cream if appropriate.

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### Our Key Learning

At Willow Park, we continue to strive for excellence in all areas of education. This week in our classroom, we've had an exciting and busy time learning different subjects!



In **Phonics**, we have introduced a new Phonics Scheme called Monster Phonics. Children have been enjoying environmental sounds, body percussion and using instruments to make rhythmic sounds. Some of our children have started to learning letter sounds and grouping classroom items in the right groups based on the <u>sound</u> they start with.

When your child is ready to hear and say the initial sounds in words, it is absolutely vital that they learn the **pure <u>sounds</u>** of the letters and not the letters of the alphabet to begin with. This will enable them to develop their reading and writing skills later. <u>Click here for a video that can help you and your child understand **pure sounds**</u>

In **Maths**, we have been exploring shapes, continuing our counting practice and making patterns. Children have been matching shapes with the shapes puzzles, finding shapes all over the classroom and sorting those shapes into the right groups. We have continued counting and making repeating patterns during all our continuous provision times.

We've had lots of exciting and enriched learning opportunities this half-term. Rugby **Fire Brigade** bought their fire engine to school and let us explore. The children enjoyed sitting in the truck, putting on a fire fighters' helmets and saying hello to the Fire Fighters.







All the children and staff really enjoyed the **walk to the church**. Every child walked so well and had a wonderful time exploring the church and all the nature we could spot!









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#### Intensive Interaction

Intensive Interaction is a communication-based approach designed for children who struggle with conventional communication. It focuses on building social communication through sensory engagement, nonverbal cues, and shared moments of interaction. The approach encourages spontaneous communication by mimicking sounds, gestures, and expressions, helping individuals connect with others in meaningful ways.



At home, parents can support intensive interaction by creating a rich, engaging environment where communication is encouraged. Simple activities like playing games, using facial expressions, and mimicking sounds or actions can help promote interaction. Parents can use eye contact, physical touch, or sounds to encourage their child's response, ensuring that communication remains a natural, relaxed experience. Consistent, patient, and responsive interactions build trust and enhance the child's communication skills over time. The key is maintaining a focus on the child's cues and ensuring that every interaction feels enjoyable and meaningful.

#### In Other News

After Easter we will have a slightly new staff structure. Kim Preston will be 'moving upstairs' to focus on her Director responsibilities and we are delighted to announce the appointment of Joel Baldwin as full-time Head teacher.
